Arrington Elementary, Inglenook Pre-K-8, and Oliver Elementary were recognized for making some of the biggest gains on the state report card scores for the 2023-24 academic year.

Inglenook made it to the top three, improving its score by 21 points year over year. Arrington and Oliver improved by 18 and 15 points, respectively.
